Maths

Ofsted maths research review

As we draw to a close this acadmeic year, an Ofsted maths research review <u>'Coordinating mathematical success'</u> has just been published. A short 1 minute summary is provided by the NCETM <u>here</u>. It highlights the positive impact that the mastery approach has had on primary mathematics and refers to the significant impact NCETM, maths hubs and Mastering Number have had on pupil's understanding. All primary schools within our Trust are engaging with the maths hub and the Mastering Number programme to stengthen subject knowledge for our staff and develop strong foundations for our pupils. This is a really strong base from which to develop and refine our mathematics teaching across the Trust. I am also excited about a new opportunity next year as I will be working with the Primary Team for the NCETM. I will be spending half my week writing materials for Mastering Number at KS2 which will focus on multiplicative reasoning. I look forward to sharing this thinking more widely with my colleagues in the Trust.

NPQ Leading Mathematics

Another welcome addition for maths education is the introduction of the NPQ for Leading Mathematics. The qualification will focus on leadership and teach participants how to lead other colleagues to embed high-quality mathematics teaching throughout a school. The NPQLPM will be available to all primary schools from February 2024. The content framework which will underpin the qualification and outlines what participants will learn and will be able to do after completing the NPQLPM is now available.

I have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know the Trust schools this year, working alongside our hardworking team of maths leads. I hope that you have a wonderful summer break and look forward to starting afresh in September with more opportunities to grow and learn together.

NEW LEADERSHIP?


If you are having a change to English Leadership, please could you let me know their names. I will then add them to our Teams channel to ensure a smooth transition in September!

Across our schools we have worked on developing our learning activities to challenge and move the children's learning on through inspiring and motivating opportunities. Our environments enable all children to progress from their individual starting points. Whilst we plan activities around children's interests we also provide opportunities to broaden children's experiences.

Being' Year One ready' can be challenging. We continue to strive to support each child to develop good learning behaviours, that lead to them accessing their learning independently. The organisational skills required in Year One can also present a challenge. Allowing enough time and support at the beginning of the first term year is essential.

PRE-SCHOOL NEWS

We are very excited that Gamlingay will have a brand new pre school up and running from September.

This pre school, along with Everton Heath will be our first settings to work with the Hygge Approach. A number of colleagues are already working on the Hygge accreditation qualifications.

This is an approach that we are hopeful will be extended across our pre schools in some format.

Diversity

This year, strides have been made to make our schools more diverse and more reflective of the communities which we serve. Trainings have been delivered to the West Village Partnership and to Hartford Infants & Juniors. All primary schools in the trust have had a behaviour and personal development review in the spring term which included an element focussing on diversity. It was so lovely to be able to go to each school and see some fantastic examples of how schools are making their curriculums and culture more reflective of the communities around them and to ensure diverse families and cultures are 'usualised' across the school.

I know many schools have had a book fair this year, run by Next Page Books (<u>Next Page Books - Next Page Books</u>). I hope that you agree with me that these book fairs had a great selection and fantastic quality of books which the children will love. At GVP, we now



have our free books from the fair which will boost the number of diverse books we have in our library. We also have two book fairs already set for next year!

Thank you so much for everybody who has spent time thinking and adapting and being more conscious of diversity this year, even just in the book choices that you make and the language that you use. This will be a piece of work which will never be complete: there will always be more to do and tweaks to make. I think it is a huge positive that the trust have really taken on board the importance of equity, diversity and inclusion and that we all try our best to ensure ALL children, no matter who they are or where they come from feel represented in what we present to them and feel valued in our schools and our society.
